Meet Laura — an inspired maker with a passion for bold colours, creative expression, and resin that tells a story. From handmade keychains and jewelry to unique collectibles (Unicorns!), Laura's work is full of character, colour, and charm.

What started a few years ago as a creative experiment is growing into a vibrant small business. She spends hours exploring new molds, testing out different types of resin — UV, deep-pour, fast-cure — and finding just the right textures, shapes, and finishes. For Laura, the process itself is a kind of magic: mixing, pouring, curing — and seeing what unexpected beauty comes out the other side.

Her inspiration is everywhere: a song she's got on repeat, a walk around the neighbourhood, or a cool design she saw online. She loves following other creators on social platforms, and she's constantly learning and trying new techniques. It's not just about making things — it's about growing, experimenting, and sharing the journey.

Beyond the craft, Laura sees her work as a way to connect. "People love buying something that has a story," she says — and her pieces do. They spark conversations, bring a little joy to someone's day, and remind us how personal handmade items can be. It's this spirit that drives her to support other small businesses too — to be part of a community that values the personal over the mass-produced.

Through her Etsy shop and Facebook page, Laura shares her work and the story behind it. She's thinking about expanding into Instagram and looking to take her creations to local markets this year — hoping to meet customers in person, share her process, and build more connections face-to-face.

For Laura, making isn't just a business — it's a way to express herself, to connect with others, and to celebrate creativity in everyday life.

In the last 3 years, we have donated over \$1,500 to the Alzheimer Society of Grey-Bruce! Way to go team!


